FortisAlberta donates equipment to Search and Rescue Alberta

When Rod Doornbosch, IT Architecture Operational Manager at FortisAlberta, learned the company was retiring radios and equipment from several fleet vehicles he saw an opportunity to donate the equipment to Search and Rescue Alberta (SAR Alberta).

This initiative resulted in a \$15,000 donation of radios, cables, antennas and Panasonic Toughbooks to SAR Alberta. FortisAlberta refurbished the equipment and ensured the radios were operating on the correct frequencies for the SAR Alberta team.

Today SAR Alberta provides more than \$2.5 million annually in support of provincial police, fire, emergency response, security and first aid throughout the province. SAR Alberta is run one-hundred percent by its 1,240 volunteers in six regions. They are responsible for ground and inland searches under the jurisdiction of the police within all regions of Alberta.

FortisAlberta seeks to give back to the communities where its employees and customers live and work through meaningful contributions to organizations and programs that are important to its customers.
